Leading in an Unknown Age of Learning:

If we re-vision schools and school systems as places of co-learning, engagement, and authentic problem solving for students and adults, then what are some of the implications for leaders and leadership? How do institutions of learning differ from institutions of teaching? I invite you, to think with me, on April 20th about how the leadership narrative is shifting. What are some of the challenges and enablers for learning and leading deeply together?

PDK-UT Chapter chooses Outstanding Educators who lives up to these challenges. The AGM, in honouring Dr. Beverley Freedman, provides us with an opportunity to meet her and gain insights about leadership in an unknown age of learning.

Currently, Bev works with OISE/University of Toronto as a sessional instructor providing training for Canadian (public, independent) and international school leaders including in Norway, Chile, and the Dominican Republic. She is connected with Canada's Outstanding Principals for The Learning Partnership and consults for TVO. Bev serves on several boards including Scientists in School, Teacher Mentors Abroad and PDK-UT.
