### THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR'S BOOK PROJECT

When the Hon. James Bartleman spoke at the Empire Club of Canada at Christmas, he talked about the book project to collect gently-used books for young readers and to send them to school libraries serving First Nations in Northern Ontario. Often these areas are inaccessible except when the lumber roads are frozen. In visiting schools in these communities, His Honour has found that the reading material is often restricted to a few government pamphlets, so he has been buying books and sending them himself. Now people are taking books to his office to help out.

Obviously, schools are an excellent source for used books. At a recent executive meeting, it was decided that we should concentrate on narratives, not text books which may be surplus due to new curricular requirements. If we could let schools know that PDK is interested in collecting books, we would be able to serve these communities in a meaningful way, and we would also raise our profile in the school system as we approach our 50th anniversary. Educators do not have much time but, if cartons are available for the books, PDK could arrange to pick them up. So far, Ed and Jocelyn Badovinac, 905-823-2819, and Susan Seidman, 416-656-6929, have volunteered to undertake some of the work. We would like to organize the books so there is material for a variety of ages in each carton for easy distribution, and put a PDK book plate in each book.

I have started with my own library and found good material. Also, for three dollars, I have bought three excellent picture books from my local library where there is some interest in the project. Also, neighbours and people at church are becoming interested. In the schools, staff and students alike could become involved, especially if we take care of the collections and delivery of the books. As an executive, we feel this is an exciting project and hope the results will be good.
