Walk for Education

University of Toronto Chapter's first annual Walk for Education made five laps of Queen's Park Circle an easy walk. H. A. Halbert School was the most active. It organized the most participants, and raised over \$500 for their nutrition program. York Humber Secondary School's nutrition program and TEOF, (Toronto Educational Opportunity Fund) were other major beneficiaries.

"I'm delighted," Principal Carolyn Moras said. "First of all, we were desperately seeking financial support for our nutrition program, so this provided a wonderful opportunity. But the walk was fun on lots of other levels. I got the chance to talk with staff and community members away from the school. We get a whole new relationship and perspective when we get to chat just as people. I also met new people with expertise in areas that I don't have. I've got the information and made contacts that will help me mentor young folks."

Phi Delta Kappa International sponsors a competition for outstanding doctoral dissertations. A committee of three reads the abstracts which are submitted through local chapters. The competition is held every other year, in even numbered years. This year, University of Toronto's Chapter has submitted Bob Postlethwaite's doctoral dissertation entitled "Giving Primacy To The Sacred: Some Implications For Teaching." Bob has a Master of Education degree from Harvard. He then went to China to teach English as a Second Language. From China he went to Taiwan, and then to Toronto. Because he has taught in English departments his classes were conducted in English. He is married, with two children. His wife teaches English as a Second Language for the Toronto District School Board.

Notes from Charles Manahan

As I write this I notice that it will be exactly one year when we celebrate our 50th anniversary of the founding of the University of Toronto Chapter of PHI DELTA KAPPA. Since we were outside the bounds of the U.S.A. we enabled P.D.K. to claim that it was an International Organization. Dean A. C. Lewis who did so much to help in making the U. of T. Chapter (085) come to pass was given the honoured #1. The rest of the 45 or so Kappans were listed in alphabetical order.

Derek Bate is Kappan #2. Just this week I noticed in the Toronto Star that D. L. Mumford had passed away and I remembered he was one of the Founding Members (#34). There are only four (4) founding members still alive and they are: Derek Bate, George Greason #18, Robert Lamb #24, and Brock Rideout #43. I am fortunate that I know three of these "oldtimers" the first three. Derek taught at the University of Toronto School, George taught with me at the Toronto Teachers' College and Bob was high up in the Secondary Federation. Don Mumford, who just died, taught at the U.T.S. and also at the Faculty of Education (in its earlier days it was known as the College of Education). He was an author of Mathematics texts. Forty-nine years takes it toll on members, as you can see. Even many who joined after the initial group have died. Just recently we have heard of the deaths of J. E. (Ted) Smith and Ed. Stewart.
